CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
SEPTEMBER 28, 2015**

The Council of the City of Mexico, Missouri met in regular session on September 28, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, with the following members present: Mayor Greg Miller; Chairman Pro Tem Chris Williams; Councilman Ron Loesch; Councilman Steve Nichols; Councilman Chris Miller. Also present were Roger Haynes, Deputy City Manager; Russell Runge, Assistant City Manager/Economic Development; Rita Jackson, Community Development Director; Kensey Russell, City Engineer/Public Works Director; Chief Susan Rockett, Public Safety Department; and Chad Shoemaker, Parks & Recreation Director; Patrick Shaw, IT Specialist; Marcy LeCount, City Clerk; City Attorney Lou Leonatti, as well as members of the media and interested citizens.

The Meeting was called to order with Mayor Miller presiding.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – SEPTEMBER 14, 2015 – REGULAR SESSION

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for approval of the September 14, 2015 regular session minutes as presented. Councilman Miller seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Abstaining, Nichols. The Minutes were approved as presented.

PUBLIC HEARING - TO CONSIDER A CHANGE TO SANITARY SEWER USE CHARGE RATES

Mayor Miller moved to open the Public Hearing. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. The Public Hearing was opened.

Mayor Miller called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to present the report.

Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that a Notice of Public Hearing was advertised in the *Mexico Ledger* August 19, 2015. The hearing was for the purpose of discussing a rate increase proposal.

Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that the City retained the engineering services of Horner & Shifrin, Inc. of St. Louis, Missouri in February to complete a capital asset analysis and facility plan on the City’s wastewater treatment operation. On April 27, 2009, Horner & Shifrin Inc. made a presentation to Council on their findings and recommendations. The study revealed that the City’s aging infrastructure, industrial pretreatment program, and modifications to the regulatory requirements mandated by the Department of Natural Resources for effluent limitations created an immediate need for an upgrade to the existing wastewater facilities. The facility plan outlined an estimated \$12,461,400 in capital improvements, with an initial Phase I estimated investment of \$5,733,400 with the remaining facility and infrastructure improvements being made through succeeding phases. Following Horner & Shifrin, Inc.’s presentation, Municipal & Financial Services Group reviewed with Council a multi-year financial projection of wastewater rates required to cover costs associated with operations, maintenance, and upcoming capital projects of the wastewater

treatment plant. On August 4, 2009, voters approved through a bond election, sewerage system revenue bonds in the amount of sixteen million dollars (\$16,000,000) by a margin of 10 to 1. On August 24, 2009, with applicable Public Hearings and voter approval for issuing revenue bonds, City Council approved by Ordinance an amendment to change sanitary sewer use charges allowing for the funding mechanism to get needed capital improvements underway. With wastewater treatment facility and collection system improvement plan phases in and a 10-year financial projection of wastewater rates supporting costs associated with operations, maintenance, and capital projects, staff moved forward and secured bond financing in the amount of \$5,765,000 for Phase I and \$5,695,000 for Phase II. In keeping with the 5-year financial projection being presented to Council and the public, a scheduled sewer rate adjustment is required to provide adequate financial resources for debt service and continued improvements to the wastewater treatment facility and collection system. Deputy City Manager Haynes recommended Council proceed with the advertised public hearing.

Council held discussion regarding the bonds that were issued and payment of the bonds. Deputy City Manager Haynes answered Council's questions regarding payments on the bonds.

There were no Public Comments.

Mayor Miller moved to close the Public Hearing. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. The Public Hearing was closed.

ORDINANCE (SECOND READINGS BY TITLE ONLY AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2015 – 50. An Ordinance Revising The Budget For The City Of Mexico, Missouri, For The Fiscal Year October 1, 2014 To September 30, 2015, Inclusive, And Adopting The Budget For The Fiscal Year October 1, 2015 To September 30, 2016, Inclusive, Appropriating The Funds As Allocated To Various Accounts And Authorizing The Expenditure Of Such Funds By The City Manager And Other Officials For The Purposes Indicated, as Amended.

Mayor Miller called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to provide the report.

Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that the Public Hearing regarding Bill No. 2015 - 80 was held September 14, 2015. As Council is aware, Staff submitted the Operating and Capital Budget for 2015 – 2016 for approval. Prior to first reading consideration, Council voted to amend the proposed budget to increase the City's contribution to \$5,000 for the Mexico Optimist Youth Sports Program. Staff has made the adjustment to the 2016 fiscal year budget. Deputy City Manager Haynes recommended Council proceed with second reading by title only and passage of Bill No. 2015 - 50.

Councilman Loesch moved for second reading by title only of Bill No. 2015 – 50 as amended. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Second reading by title only of Bill No. 2015 – 50 was read by Councilman Loesch.

Councilman Loesch moved for passage of Bill No. 2015 – 50 as amended. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Bill No. 2015 – 50 was passed as Ordinance No. 4334.

ORDINANCE (TWO READINGS BY TITLE ONLY AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2015 – 51. An Ordinance Amending Chapter 14, Article III, Division 4, Section 14-123 of the Mexico City Code Relating to the Sanitary Sewer Use Charges.

Mayor Miller called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to provide the report.

Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that the Public Hearing was held earlier in the evening providing the Council both background and future planning information for necessary capital improvements to the wastewater treatment facility and collection system. Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that if Council did not have any additional questions for Bill No. 2015 – 51, Haynes recommended Council proceed with two readings by title only and passage of Bill No. 2015 – 51, which had been posted the required length of time.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for first reading by title only of Bill No. 2015 – 51. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. First reading by title only of Bill No. 2015 – 51 was read by Chairman Pro Tem Williams.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for second reading by title only of Bill No. 2015 – 51. Councilman Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Second reading by title only of Bill No. 2015 – 51 was read by Chairman Pro Tem Williams.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for passage of Bill No. 2015 – 51 as amended. Councilman Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Bill No. 2015 – 51 was passed as Ordinance No. 4335.

RESOLUTIONS (READING AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2015 – 52. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Sign a Storage Lease with Pete Renner.

Deputy City Manager Haynes called upon Assistant City Manager Runge to provide the report.

Assistant City Manager Runge stated that Bill No. 2015 – 52 authorizes the City Manager to sign a Storage Lease with the Pete Renner. Robert Witherell and Pete Renner previously had a lease to rent Storage Hangar 6 at the Mexico Memorial Airport. Mr. Witherell notified the City that he no longer has an interest in renting the storage hangar but Pete Renner would like to continue. The Storage Lease with Renner will be for a term of one year which automatically renews at the end of the first year. The storage hangar rent will be \$40 per month. Assistant City Manager Runge recommended Council proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2015 - 52.

Councilman Nichols moved for reading of Bill No. 2015 – 52. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Bill No. 2015 – 52 was read in its entirety by Councilman Nichols.

Councilman Nichols moved for passage of Bill No. 2015 – 52. Councilman Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Loesch, Williams, G. Miller, C. Miller, Nays, one. Absent, Nichols. Bill No. 2015 – 52 was passed as Resolution No. 3739.

Bill No. 2015 – 53. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Execute Agreements with Various Organizations for Requested Funding from the Mexico Tourism Tax.

Mayor Miller called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to provide the report.

Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that the City of Mexico currently has a tourism tax that is collected by the hotels/motels within the city limits. Bill No. 2015 – 53 authorizes the City Manager to execute agreements with various organizations to receive tourism funding for an advertising campaign. The Mexico Tourism Commission has reviewed the application and recommends to the Mexico City Council the distribution of funds as follows: Missouri Life for the 2015-2016 Advertising Campaign - \$11,000; Mexico Area Chamber of Commerce for the 2015 Holiday Express Advertising - \$ 2,000; and Presser Performing Arts Center for the 2015 Holiday Production - \$3,000. Deputy City Manager Haynes recommended Council concur with the Mexico Tourism Commission's recommendation and proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2015 – 53.

Mayor Miller moved for reading of Bill No. 2015 – 53. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none. Bill No. 2015 – 53 was read in its entirety by Councilman Miller.

Councilman Miller moved for passage of Bill No. 2015 – 53. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Loesch, Williams, G. Miller, C. Miller, Nays, one. Absent, Nichols. Bill No. 2015 – 53 was passed as Resolution No. 3740.

OTHER BUSINESS

Claims

The list of claims was presented for approval.

Councilman Nichols moved for approval of the list of claims as presented. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller, Nays, none.

The list of claims was approved.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilman Loesch congratulated Chief Susan Rockett on her recent appointment to the Missouri Medal of Valor Review Board. Councilman Loesch made positive comments regarding the recent Walk Back In Time event held at the Audrain County Historical Society complex.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams made positive comments regarding the Walk Back In Time event.

Councilman Nichols congratulated Chief Susan Rockett on her recent appointment to the Missouri Medal of Valor Review Board. Councilman Nichols inquired as to the recent drug collection program sponsored by the Mexico Department of Public Safety. Councilman Nichols also made positive comments regarding the Mexico Young Farmers Truck and Tractor Pull and the Walk Back In Time.

Councilman Miller commented on Chief Susan Rockett's appointment to the Missouri Medal of Valor Review Board. Councilman Miller commented on the success of Walk Back In Time.

Deputy City Manager Haynes commented on the Missouri Military Academy's cadets volunteering for the new park equipment placement and work at the animal shelter. Deputy City Manager Haynes reported on the progress of the Huntingfield Bridge replacement. Deputy City Manager Haynes reported on the Missouri Municipal League's Innovation award to the City of Mexico, the Award for the community garden project. Deputy City Manager Haynes stated that the project was a joint effort between the City of Mexico and several local organizations.

Mayor Miller expressed appreciation to Director Shoemaker and to the organizations that participated in the community garden project. Mayor Miller made positive comments regarding the Walk Back In Time event. Mayor Miller commented on the memorial service held for Trooper James Bava at the Audrain County Sheriff's office.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Carolyn Sveda, 1503 N Clark, spoke on concerns regarding a recent gun shooting in the 1500 block of N Clark. Sveda stated that a neighborhood watch program has been established and that the group is seeking assistance from the City to set a lower speed limit and increase lighting in the area.

ADJOURNMENT

Mayor Miller moved to close the open session. The motion was seconded by Chairman Pro Tem Williams. The Chair called for a vote and motion carried with the vote as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Nichols, Loesch, G. Miller. Nays, none. The City Council Regular Session Meeting was adjourned.
