DECEMBER 12, 2016**

The Council of the City of Mexico, Missouri met in work session on December 12, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, with the following members present: Mayor Greg Miller, Councilman Ron Loesch; Councilman Steve Nichols and Councilman Chris Miller. Also present were Bruce R. Slagle, City Manager; Roger D. Haynes, Deputy City Manager; Russell Runge, Assistant City Manager/Economic Development; Chief Susan Rockett, Department of Public Safety Director; Rita Jackson, Community Development Director; Kensey Russell, City Engineer/Public Works Director; Chad Shoemaker, Parks & Recreation Director; Andrew Williford, City Civil Engineer; Patrick Shaw, IT Specialist; City Attorney Lou Leonatti and Marcy LeCount, City Clerk, as well as members of the media and interested citizens. The Council of the City of Mexico, Missouri met in regular session on December 12, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, with the following members present: Mayor Greg Miller; Chairman Pro Tem Chris Williams; Councilman Ron Loesch; Councilman Steve Nichols; Councilman Chris Miller. Also present were Bruce Slagle, City Manager; Roger Haynes, Deputy City Manager; Russell Runge, Assistant City Manager/Economic Development; Chad Shoemaker, Parks & Recreation Director; Kensey Russell, Public Works Director/City Engineer, Rita Jackson, Community Development Director, Chief Susan Rockett, Public Safety Department; Drew Williford, City Civil Engineer; Patrick Shaw, IT Specialist; City Attorney Lou Leonatti; Marcy LeCount, City Clerk; as well as members of the media and interested citizens.

The Meeting was called to order with Mayor Miller presiding.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – NOVEMBER 28, 2016 – REGULAR SESSION

Councilman Loesch moved for approval of the November 28, 2016 regular session minutes as presented. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Abstain, Williams. The Minutes were approved as presented.

RESOLUTIONS (READING AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2016 – 77. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Sign Contract Documents with Mick Mehler and Sons Inc. for the Green Estate Park Culvert and Drainage Improvements Phase II.

City Manager Slagle called upon Director Shoemaker to provide the report.

Director Shoemaker stated that the 2016 – 2017 annual budget allows \$30,000 for the Green Estate Park Culvert and Drainage Improvements Phase II project. Advertisements for bids were placed in the *Mexico Ledger* on November 11, 2016 for the Green Estate Park Culvert and Drainage Improvements Phase II. Drawings, specifications and other related contract information were also available at American Document Solutions and planroom.adsmo.net. Bids were opened on November 29, 2016 with one (1) bid received from Mick Mehler and Sons Inc. in the amount of \$30,980. Director Shoemaker recommended Council proceed with reading and passage of Bill no. 2016 – 77.

Council Members held discussion regarding the culvert and drainage improvements at Green Estate Park.

Councilman Loesch moved for reading of Bill No. 2016 – 77. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Bill No. 2016 – 77 was read in its entirety by Councilman Loesch.

Councilman Loesch moved for passage of Bill No. 2016 – 77. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on

passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Bill No. 2016 – 77 was passed as Resolution 3800.

Bill No. 2016 – 78 A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Enter Into An Agreement with Horner & Shifrin, Inc. to Provide Professional Services Related to Aeration Blower Replacement at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.

City Manager Slagle called upon Director Russell to provide the report.

Director Russell stated that the 2016 – 2017 budget allows \$500,000 for the aeration system blower replacements at the wastewater treatment plant. A proposal was received from Horner & Shifrin, Inc. to provide professional services related to the Blower Replacement Project in the amount of \$51,176. Horner & Shifrin has been the Engineers of record throughout the upgrading of the wastewater plant. They are familiar with the plant equipment and processes and Staff feels that it is best to continue to use them for the aeration system blower replacement. Director Russell recommended Council proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2016 – 78.

Council Members held discussion regarding the replacement of the aeration blowers at the wastewater treatment plant.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for reading of Bill No. 2016 – 78. Councilman Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Bill No. 2016 – 78 was read in its entirety by Chairman Pro Tem Williams.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for passage of Bill No. 2016 – 78. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Bill No. 2016 – 78 was passed as Resolution 3801.

Bill No. 2016 – 79. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Enter Into A Design and Construction Contract with Frazier Davis Construction Company for Construction of Two Post Tensioned Concrete Pickleball Courts.

City Manager Slagle called upon Director Shoemaker to provide the report.

Director Shoemaker stated that the 2016 – 2017 budget allows \$45,000 for the construction of two post tensioned concrete pickleball courts at Fairgrounds Park. Construction costs will be reimbursed to the City from the Mexico Park Foundation. A request for sealed design build proposals was advertised in the Mexico Ledger and was also sent to twelve (12) contractors. Three sets of qualifications were received with Frazier Davis Construction Company being selected as the most qualified. A design build proposal totaling \$66,529 was negotiated for the site grading, engineered fill, installation and surfacing of two courts. Director Shoemaker stated that Staff has met with the Audrain Tennis Association and Frazier Davis Construction to discuss and approve the design and construction of the project. The Mexico Parks Foundation has available funds for the entire project. Director Shoemaker recommended Council Proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2016 – 79.

Council Members held discussion regarding the construction of the pickleball courts at Fairgrounds Park.

Councilman Nichols moved for reading of Bill No. 2016 – 79. Councilman Miller seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Bill No. 2016 – 79 was read in its entirety by Councilman Nichols and Councilman Miller.

Councilman Miller moved for passage of Bill No. 2016 – 79. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none. Bill No. 2016 – 79 was passed as Resolution 3802.

Appointment to the Mexico Airport Advisory Board

Mayor Miller called upon City Manager Slagle to provide the report.

City Manager Slagle stated that this agenda item concerns an opening on the Mexico Airport Advisory Board which needs to be appointed by City Council.

Mexico Airport Advisory Board Sebastian Heintz' term expired October 2016 and Mr. Heintz is not eligible for reappointment. There are two vacancies on this board, one position to be filled by a resident of Mexico and one to be filled by an individual that may reside outside of the Mexico city limits. Staff has received an application from Roger Dubbert expressing an interest in serving on this board and he resides outside of the Mexico city limits. The term is 3 years, expiring October 2019. City Manager Slagle recommended Council make an appointment to the Mexico Airport Advisory Board.

Councilman Miller made a motion to appoint Roger Dubbert to a 3 year term, expiring October 2019 on the Mexico Airport Advisory Board. Councilman Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, C. Miller, Williams, Loesch, G. Miller, Nichols. Nays, none.

Discussion of December 26, 2016 Meeting

City Manager Slagle stated that the Council will need to discuss holding the December 26, 2016 meeting due to the Christmas Holiday. If Council decides to cancel the meeting, Council will need to allow Staff to prepay necessary bills for city operation.

The City has maintained a contract with a local contractor to provide various maintenance services on hourly equipment and labor cost basis. This service has been used primarily to repair sewer lines, but has also been used to help with street patching and snow removal around the square from time to time. The contract is a one-year contract with an option to renew for a second year.

The request for services was advertised according to the City's purchasing policy with bids received on December 19, 2016. Three (3) contractors responded with Plan B Development submitting the lowest bid.

Dear City Council Members:

The attached Resolution authorizes the City Manager to enter into a Grease Trap Inspection Program Agreement with the Audrain County Health Department (ACHD).

The Mexico City Code requires suitable grease, oil and grit interceptors to be installed in all commercial food preparation businesses. The grease interceptors must be maintained continuously in efficient operation by the business owner at the business owner's expense. The City requires such grease interceptors be readily and easily accessible for cleaning and inspection.

ACHD has agreed to perform the public health related service and function related to the Grease Trap Inspection Program within the Mexico city limits. An inspection cycle and updated list will be agreed upon by both parties and the City will be provided a written monthly report. The City will pay a \$200 fee per year for each business listed with a grease trap. The City has also included in the agreement that special requests or inspections, related to grease traps and as requested by the City, may be billed separately and at a rate not to exceed \$25.00 per hour. The agreement will be effective January 1, 2017 to December 31, 2019.

Staff recommends that the City of Mexico and the Audrain County Health Department enter into an agreement and that Council give reading and passage to the attached Resolution.
